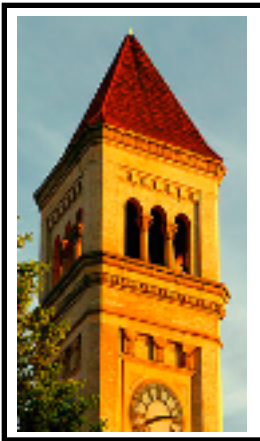

Join Spokane Rotary Club 21 for the District 5080 Rotary Conference celebrating 100 years of Rotary.

The conference will be held at the West Coast Ridpath Hotel in downtown Spokane on June 2nd through 5th, 2005.

The conference hotel is only a few short blocks from the River Park Square downtown shopping mall, Riverfront Park, the Convention Center and the Centennial Trail.

The conference will begin with a golf tournament at the beautiful Indian Canyon Golf Course, Thursday afternoon, June 2. That evening there will be a celebration of Rotary's 100th year at River Front Park and the Convention Center.

The District Governor, Lloyd Gray, has chosen "**Flowing Into the Future**" as the theme for the 2005 Conference. An adequate supply of clean water is a critical issue to not only District 5080, but is a "life and death" issue in much of the developing world and Rotary has been very active in bringing water to areas which have lacked and adequate supply.

Rotary Clubs throughout the district have been invited to design and construct table-top water features which will be displayed at the conference and then auctioned to raise funds for Rotary International.

The informal secondary theme of the conference is Let Us Entertain You; beginning with the Thursday night 100th Anniversary Celebration, there will be numerous chances for attendees to have a good time in Spokane. Among the events available are a Spokane Wine Tour, a cruise on beautiful Lake Coeur d'Alene, Historic Spokane's Age of Elegance Tour, a walking tour of downtown Spokane and the Spokane Art Fest.
