☆ **RYLA - CANDIDATE WELCOME** ☆



RYLA is an intensive international seven day leadership training program for current and potential Youth Leaders, aged 18-25 year old, sponsored by the Rotary Club of District 5080. It will be held at Selkirk College Campus in Castlegar from July 9 to 16. The awards are available to young people from throughout the district who have completed grade 12 and displayed some leadership potential. Candidates may be single or married. Prospective candidates must submit their application prior to May 31 to their local rotary Club. The award will cover the tuition for the training program and room and board at the College.

RYLA AGENDA - Using a small group format with presentations and lots of opportunities for group discussion, successful candidates will look at the following topics: - keys to understanding ourselves and others, - importance of communications in effective leadership, - elements of community and global leadership, - goal setting, - motivation, - styles of leadership, - what makes an effective leader, - group dynamics, ethics, - critical thinking, - Rotary's purpose and service to the community and other topics. Presentations will feature a variety of speakers from a variety of leadership perspectives.

☆ **A SNIPIT OF TRAIL ROTARY**

HISTORY ☆

1929 - Fresh Air Camp at Syringa Creek - The property was donated by the CM&S Company and the bridges, btc. erected by the rotary club. The camp was designated for children under 14 and their mothers. The Rotary Club supplied the food and the mother's prepared it. The camp was turned over t the Salvation Army in 1955 and was operated by them until the construction of the High Arow Dam.

1968 - Kiro Manor Was Under Constructon - Committee work began to purchase property acquire the necessary permits and zoning arrangements etc. Jubilee Place is located in Jubilee Park or what was known as the old rink site. The building was ready for occupancy in 1982 at a cost of \$1.2 million. It has35 apts. and is operated by the Trail Elderly Citizens Society with Ed Nicholls as the President.
