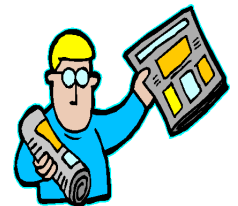

The social hour will start at 5pm followed by a buffet dinner. Guests are welcomed and encouraged.

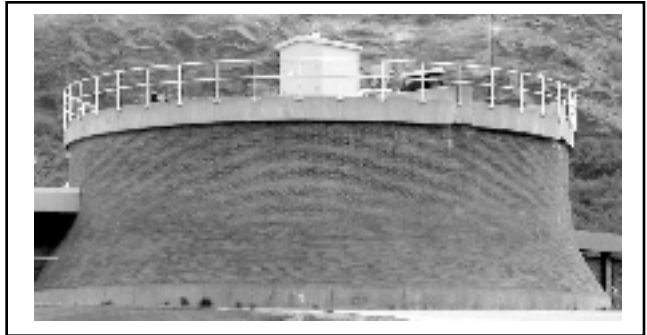

RCMP issue news release re: policing priorities
Youth Issues a Priority For Greater Trail Area Communities

During consultations held with the RCMP and the communities in the Greater Trail area, the issue of youth-related criminal activity was identified as a priority on which the members of Trail & Greater District RCMP Detachment should focus. Equally as important, several youth-related incidents over the past several months have caused concern for the citizens of our communities.

Trail & Greater District RCMP Detachment has been selected as a pilot site for a planning and employee development process which encompasses the priorities identified by the community. In this particular case, the priority of youth-related criminal activity has been incorporated by:

Positive discussions have already been held with the RCMP and the Cities of Trail and Rossland where possible initiatives have been explored. The RCMP hope to bring the other local municipal councils into this process as we are likely to have more success by taking an integrated, coordinated approach to this issue which is impacting all of the communities within the Greater Trail area.
