TRAIL ROTARY WORLD COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE MEETING

JULY 18 2005 (PRESENT: JAN, LEIGH, PIOTR, BETTY ANNE, BRUCE)

1. Criteria for selecting projects. Jan to produce next draft.

2. **Size of project.** Club Directors are keen to have some type of project in place by next spring. A full Matching Grant application will take longer than this to be approved. Therefore the initial approach should be to look for a small project suitable for a Simplified District Grant. An application for this would need to be submitted this September. Subsequently we hope a bigger project could be developed at the same site.

3. **Nicaragua.** Contact in place (friend of Leigh at San Juan Del Sol). Potential Rotary Club Managua. Next step more info about suitable projects and try and establish contact with Rotary Club. Leigh.

4. **Guatemala.** Contact in place (friend of Jan's sister). She will be visiting Trail Sept. Potential Rotary Club Quetzaltenango. Next step more info about suitable projects and try and contact a Rotary Club. Jan.

5. **Peru.** Piotr will try Cliff again to see if he has any good contacts in Peru.

6. **Travel costs.** Piotr reported that travel costs to Central America and Peru similar but Brazil and India more expensive.

7. **Other locations.** All members to keep researching for possible projects bearing in mind the comments in (2) above. Contact with members of the District WCS Committee also worthwhile.

8. **Measures of success.** Betty Anne to draft these for next meeting.

9. **Next Meeting.** Leigh's office Aug 23/05 at 5pm.

Criteria for Selection

1. Relative safety for Rotary and Interact members traveling to the project
2. Cost and accessibility of travel
3. Contact with a Rotary club in the host country willing to work with us
4. Located in a country eligible for matched funding
5. A project or series of projects that will have impact and have a means of measuring success or having an identifiable completion point
6. A smaller project that is immediately identifiable for potential 1:1 District simplified grant funding application in September
7. Dollar value of the project(s) to be completed
8. Project(s) that will draw on Rotarian skills and elicit club engagement (including language skills)
9. Project(s) suitable to Interact involvement

Measures of Success:

1. Identify a community - one where we see opportunities for growth of our international service
2. Establish a small project
3. Rotarian visit to community
4. Identify a large project for future
5. Gain experience as a Rotary Club and engage more members in international service
