❖ Casa Centenario

- Temporary accommodation for out-of-town families and out-patients using KBRH
- Major milestone is to negotiate purchase of convent adjacent St. Michaels School.

- Identify site and obtain recommendations from a bioengineering consultant regarding plant types and location

❖ Communities in Bloom Garden

- Work parties required to plant and remove annuals at the Memorial Arena flowerbed.

- Carol Fest prior to Christmas to raise funds for food baskets.

Community Service

❖ Rotary Park

- Remove trees along riverbank; install waste receptacle; “greening” area to north of park and a work party to cleanup the beach.
- Long term plans include stair access to river, river walkway and vehicle access restriction to Riverside.

❖ Assistance to Erickson Trust

- Expect to have about 4 or \$5,000 for the coming year
