Outbound Student 2007/08

-We did not receive any applications, but Rossland received three. I participated in the interviews conducted by the Rossland Club and we identified a good candidate for our club. She is quite posed, has good grades, seems well-rounded, has done some traveling and lived in Hawaii with her family for three years, so she has some experience with adjusting to new living arrangements. World Community Service

President Leigh has successfully submitted an application for a \$1,000 district simplified grant to buy a cement mixer for Casita Linda in San Miguel.

Other priorities for this year, as previously reported.

-Donate approx \$1,200 US to build a house at Casita Linda in Mexico. This money would not attract any form of matching grant.

-Donate \$1,000 US to the Guatemala Literacy Project. This money should be a contribution towards a larger multi-club donation, which would be eligible for RI Matching Grant status.

The students are selling chocolates to raise funds toward their primary goal for the year of raising \$1,200 to fund another house at Casita Linda, which the club will match.
